

Neeraj feels Zelezny's tweaks will help breach 90m mark

Two-time Olympic medal-winning javelin throw star Neeraj Chopra has re-vealed that his new coach Jan Zelezny has figured our mistakes in his technique and he would now make some adjustments to his throwing routine to achieve the 90m mark that the Indian star is pursuing for a while.

"I believe a 90-plus throw is happening soon. He (Jan Zelezny) has made some technical adjust-ments in my game," said Neerai.

"He (Zelezny) feels that his tweaks would help me. I've been able to understand what he expects from me. One of the mistakes that he told me about was how I was throwing very low even in Paris and that I was leaning towards the left.

"If I am able to incorpo rate those changes, I think I will get a lot better," he

Medals more important but the 26-year-old insisted that the milestone is still not as important as winning medals for the country. "I want to do it myself. But, going to a competition and winning a medal against people who have previously thrown 90 metres is even more important. There's no point in throwing 90 metres and not winning."
